The Summers County Recycling Center has switched to winter hours. The Center is now open from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Saturday hours are 8 a.m. until noon.

Hinton native awarded Navy Meritorious Civilian Service Medal

NAVY, (Hinton News) - The United States Navy awarded Hinton native, Dawn (Katz) Rodes, with the Department of the Navy Meritorious Civilian Service Award (NMCSA), their third highest civilian service award, for exemplary leadership, exceptional ability, initiative, and total dedication in the performance of her duties. Rodes managed a team consisting of government and industry experts in the removal and remediation of the U.S. Fleet Operational Readiness Accuracy Check Site (FORACS) located on the west coast of Oahu, Hawaii from May 2017 through June 2022. During this project, she organized the removal of in-water conduits and cables and ashore concrete conduit,

manholes, and broken concrete associated with the Fleet Operational Readiness Accuracy Check Site (FORACS). She also coordinated the removal of potential safety hazards and environmental remediation of the site, making it a safe and aesthetically pleasing addition to the State of Hawaii's public oceanfront. The project also included transplanting live coral that had grown on the underwater cables, preserving an important part of the oceanic ecosystem. Rodes collaborated with a host of activities and agencies including the Army Corps of Engineers, Navy Region Hawaii Public Affairs Office, Mobile Dive and Salvage Unit One, State of Hawaii Department of Land & Natural Resources and

many others. Her efforts directly enabled the Navy to fulfill its lease agreement with the State of Hawaii and satisfactorily restored the site to as close as possible to its original state.

Rodes is a 1995 graduate of Summers County High School, a 2000 graduate of Concord University, and earned a Masters in Business Administration from The Citadel in 2005. In her more than 15 years as a Department of the Navy civilian employee, she has held the positions of Business Financial Manager (BFM) of the Europe Division for Navy Information Warfare Center (NIWC) Atlantic (formerly Space and Naval Warfare Systems Center (SPAWAR)), BFM for the Test & Evaluation (T&E) Program for Naval Sea Sys-

tems Command (NAVSEA), Ranges Deputy Program Manager and Deputy U.S. Representative to NATO FORACS, and is currently the Ranges Program Manager and the United States National Representative to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) Naval Forces Sensor and Weapon Accuracy Check Sites (FORACS).

Rodes is married to her high school sweetheart and Hinton native, David Rodes, and they have three beautiful daughters. They currently reside in Connecticut.

Rodes is the daughter of Hinton native, Ruby Meadows Wiseman, and the granddaughter of Juanita Cales Meadows.

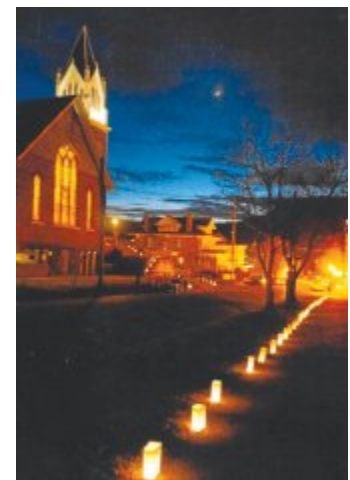

Memories of the Past: The Cross in the Sky

In all our lives, certain events mold us and stick with us long after they occur. For my Granny, the night of December 6, 1941, was one of those times.


It was a warm spring day as we sat on the porch, and Granny began to recount the story of that night to me. I believe it's from my Granny that I developed a love of sharing stories from the past to carry on for future generations.

Granny began her story by explaining that she and my grandpa were living at Tug Creek when this occurred. She said they were out in the yard talking to their neighbor Buddy when suddenly the sky lit up like it was daytime. All three heads turned to look skyward. She said what they saw made cold chills run up and down their spine. She said it was beautiful and scary at the same time. They saw a gigantic gold cross outlined in pearls. She said it appeared to take up most of the sky. She went on to say that it stayed awhile and disappeared as suddenly as it appeared.

Buddy, their neighbor, ran back home to his house. Many people thought the end of the world was coming. Granny said she and grandpa went into their house and talked about what they thought was going to happen. Grandpa said he knew something would happen, or a cross wouldn't have appeared.

The next day they received word that Pearl Harbor had been bombed and the US was now involved in the war. They knew right away what the pearl-studded cross had signified.

Granny went on to tell me how hard times got during the war; you had to patch holes in your shoes with cardboard because shoes were rationed. She spoke of how you had to learn to adjust all your recipes because so many good staples were also among the rationed items. My Granny was the strongest and most resilient woman I've ever known. If I'm even half the woman she was, then I've not failed at this thing called life.
