

Last week, we began looking at how people who do not value the truth will lash out at the messenger. We ended right in the middle of an explanation of how some people who are in the wrong will attack others because their works are evil and the works of the other person are righteous.

## Do You Love The Truth?

by David Padfield

The same thing happens today—the preacher preaches the truth and someone gets their feelings hurt because it reflects upon them. Instead of repenting of the error of their ways, the guilty party will often lash out at other people. Sometimes they lash out at their husband, wife or children. Weak Christians will often lash out at faithful Christians who happen to be nearby.

This is the same problem the apostle Peter had (John 21:15-23). Just prior to His ascension back into heaven, Jesus asked the apostle Peter three times if he loved Him. Peter was deeply grieved by the questions and then pointed to John and said, "But Lord, what about this man?" Our Lord responded by telling Peter it was none of his business. Peter had an obligation to follow Jesus regardless of what John did.

Some People Will Harden Their Heart

Look at the example of Pharaoh during the time of Moses. God said He would harden Pharaoh's heart (Exo. 4:21; 7:3). But, the Bible also says Pharaoh hardened his own heart (Exo. 8:15, 32; 9:34). What happened was this: every one of the plagues made Pharaoh more rebellious against God. It was not God's plan to terrify Pharaoh into submission—every plague was a warning designed to give him another chance to soften his heart, but Pharaoh refused. In our day, the preaching of the gospel has had on many souls exactly the same effect as the Lord's demand to Pharaoh.

The real question is, "What shall my attitude be towards the commands of God?" Will my heart be hardened or softened by God's appeal to me? Will I deny myself, take up my cross and follow Him (Matt. 16:24)? My attitude and actions will depend upon whether or not I love

Paul warned the Hebrew Christians about this very thing. They were told to not harden their hearts like their ancestors did in the wilderness (Heb. 3:7-13). It is possible for us to harden our hearts through the "deceitfulness of sin."

On one occasion Paul had the opportunity to preach to Felix. Luke tells us that as Paul 'reasoned about righteousness, self-control, and the judgment to come, Felix was afraid and answered, 'Go away for now; when I have a convenient time I will call for you'" (Acts 24:25). There is no record of Felix ever obeying the gospel of Christ—he allowed his heart to grow

## Some People Will Allow The Gospel To Change Their Lives!

One of the greatest stories of conversion in the Bible took place in the ancient city of Nineveh. God sent Jonah, a reluctant prophet, to preach to them. "The people of Nineveh believed God, proclaimed a fast, and put on sackcloth, from the greatest to the least of them" (Jonah 3:5). The people of Nineveh repented at the preaching of Jonah. "Then God saw their works, that they turned from their evil way; and God relented from the disaster that He had said He would bring upon them, and He did not do it" (Jonah 3:10).

Next week we will see how King David and other pure hearts responded to the truth.

with less visible fat and Learning ways to low- trim the fat from your meat prior to cooking. Lean beef cuts include the round chuck, sirloin or loin. Lean pork cuts include tenderloin or loin chop. Buy lean or extra lean ground beef. Broil meat instead of frying. Remove skin from chicken and turkey prior to cooking. Fish is low in saturated fat. Eat more vegetables and fruit. Choose to cook with liquid vegetable oils rather than solid fats. Also, choose 1% or skim milk and cheeses and increase your fiber and whole



## A Peek into Summers County's Past: Talcott School Gymnasium


TALCOTT W.Va. (Hinton News) - It is time for another edition of A Peek into Summers County's Past. Every week, local history collector William Jones talks about items from his collection and their historical significance. In honor of the recent rededication of the old Talcott School Gymnasium, Jones is discussing the history of the gym and the man for whom it is now named.

To begin the conversation, Jones said, "It only seemed fitting that this week's piece centered around the Talcott School Gymnasium since it was recently restored with COVID-19 money Summers County received. It was also renamed and dedicated in honor of Coach Dallas 'Bud' Mann. Who is better known as 'Coach Mann' by the locals and especially students like my father and myself who had Coach Mann during our time at Talcott School."

"First I will talk a bit about Coach Mann before delving into the history of the gymnasium. He had a long history with Talcott School, having been one of the seniors in the 1957 graduating class. Then in 1962 was a graduate of Concord College. His first teaching job was at Streeter School and then he went to Forest Hill School where he coached basketball."

Continuing, Jones noted, "Then, in 1966, he transferred to Talcott School where he taught physical education, and coached baseball and basketball. It was here he earned the name that he is so well known for today, 'Coach Mann.' He then went on to teach at the middle school when Talcott consolidated, he finished his Talcott tenure in the spring of 1994 before moving on to Hinton. He finished out the remainder of his teaching career at Summers County Middle School where he retired in 2005 with 43 years of being a teacher and coach. In 1997 he was recognized with the Teacher of the Year award. The photo you see of him is from my father's 1974 yearbook."

"It is only fitting that the recently refurbished Tal-School gymnasium new elementary school was completed in 2008. Which means that it sat empty for 15 years.
